


MODERN SLAVERY CHILD REFERRAL PATHWAY

If you have child protection concerns, also consider whether the child could be a potential victim of trafficking or slavery. Below are some indicators and questions, that may help to form your decision.

Examples of indicators that may suggest a child is a victim of trafficking or slavery:

GENERAL INDICATORS

- 1. Evidence of control over movement, either as an individual or as a group
- 2. Found in or connected to a type of location likely to be used for exploitation
- 3. Restriction of movement and confinement to the workplace or to a limited area
- 4. Doesn't know home or work address
- 5. Threats against the individual or their family members
- 6. Living with people with whom they have no known relationship
- 7. Not registered or known to local services (school/health/GP Practice)

Examples of questions that may be helpful having a conversation with a potential victim of trafficking or slavery:

Please consider the safety and comfort of the child before asking these questions. It may be more appropriate for someone else/a different agency to speak to the child.

- Where are you living?
- Who are you living with?
- How did you arrive in the UK? (modes of transport/other places travelled through enroute could indicate trafficking)
- Who did you come with? How did you meet this person and what is their relationship to the child?
- Are you forced to do things you don't want to do?
- Have you any pain/physical injuries that you need me to help you with?
- Are you worried that someone may hurt you or your family if you don't do what they want?

<u>Note</u>: The above are not exhaustive lists and are there for guidance, don't ignore the obvious, e.g. someone tells you that they have been exploited. If in any doubt – continue with your referral.
